


Easy cutting will give you an "uninterrupted" view out of the Cabin Windows. A cozy throw for in front of the fire or a wall hanging, this quilt will be a classic for years to come.

A		42259-X Multi	1 1/8	Center squares: Cut (4) 17-1/2" squares. Fussy cut them across the width and length o the fabric. It will look more "natural" if all the windows are different. Cut each square into pieces following the diagram below. Label each piece so that you don't get the windows mixed up. Give each block a different letter and number the pieces as shown below.

#### Center Squares:


Sew 8 sashing strips:  $2-1/2" \times 1-1/2"$ , cornerstone,  $12-1/2" \times 1-1/2"$ , cornerstone,  $2-1/2" \times 1-1/2"$ . Press toward the cornerstones.

Between A-1, A-2, and A-3, insert 2-1/2" x 1-1/2" sashing strips. Press toward sashing.

Between A-4, A-5 and A-6, insert 12-1/2" x 1-1/2" sashing strips.

Between A-7, A-8 and A-9, insert **2-1/2"** x **1-1/2"** sashing strips.

Sew the rows together, inserting sashing strips. Your block should look like the block below. Repeat for blocks, B, C and D.



#### Border #1:

Sew 3 border-strips of cornerstone, 18-1/2" x 1-1/2", cornerstone, 18-1/2" x 1-1/2", cornerstone. Press toward the cornerstones.

Between A and B blocks, insert 18-1/2" x 1-1/2" strips. Press toward border.

On both sides, sew an 18-1/2" x 1-1/2" strip. Press toward border.

Repeat the above for blocks C and D.

Sew a border strip on the top of A/B.

Sew a border strip between A/B and C/D.

Sew a border strip at the **bottom of C/D**.

The center should look like the picture on the following page.





#### Borders:

Measure the center of the quilt from top to bottom through the center. It should measure **39-1/2"**. If it doesn't, make a note of what it does measure.

Measure the center of the quilt from side to side through the center. It should measure the same as the measurement from top to bottom. If it doesn't, make a note of what it does measure.

If they measure the same, you are OK to proceed. If they don't, take an average of the two.

Trim **two lengths** of border #2 to the measurement you have gotten above.

Sew to each side of the quilt. Press toward the border.

Trim the remaining **two lengths** of border #2 to the measurement above **plus 8"**. This should be **47-1/2"**, but use the different measurement if you have averaged.

Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt.

Repeat the same procedure for border #3, except **add 2"** after the sides have been sewn on. This should measure **49-1/2".** 

Repeat for border #4, except **add 12"** after the sides have been sewn on. This should measure **61-1/2".** 

#### Finishing:

Create a sandwich of top, batting and backing. Quilt and bind as desired.
