

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#### Cutting:

Fabric A: (2) strips 17/8" x width of fabric (WOF). Sub cut (25) 17/8" squares.

(6) strips 1 ½" x WOF. Sew end to end and sub cut (2) 1 ½" x 60 ½" side inner borders.

Sub cut (2) 1 1/2" x 62 1/2" top and bottom inner borders.

(10) strips 1 1/2" x WOF.

Fabric B: (5) strips 2 7/8" x WOF. Sub cut (64) 2 7/8" squares, cut once on the diagonal.

(4) strips 5 1/2" x WOF. Sub cut (25) 5 1/2" squares, cut twice on the diagonal.

(4) strips 4 1/2" x WOF. Sub cut (36) 4 1/2" squares.

Fabric C: (1) strip 6" x WOF. Sub cut (25) 1 ½" x 6 rectangles.

(5) strips 2 7/8" x WOF. Sub cut (64) 2 7/8" squares, cut once on the diagonal.

(8) strips 2 1/2" x WOF for binding.

Fabric D: (1) strip 4" x WOF. Sub cut (25) 1 1/2" x 4" rectangles.

Fabric E: (1) strip 2 7/8" x WOF. Sub cut (25) 1 1/2" x 2 7/8" rectangles.

Fabric F: (1) strip 1 7/8" x WOF Sub cut (25) 1 7/8" squares

Fabric G: (1) strip 5" x WOF. Sub cut (25) 1 ½" x 5" rectangles.

(10) strips 1 1/2" x WOF.

Fabric H: (8) strips 5 ¼" x WOF. Sub cut (50) 5 ¼" squares, cut twice on the diagonal.

Fabric I: (1) strip 4" x WOF. Sub cut (25) 1 1/2" x 4" rectangles.

Fabric J: (1) strip 5" x WOF. Sub cut (25) 1 1/2" x 5" rectangles.

Fabric K: (1) strip 2 7/8" x WOF. Sub cut (25) 1 1/2" x 2 7/8" rectangles.

(7) strips 4 ½" x WOF. Sew end to end and sub cut (2) 4 ½" x 62 ½" side outer border strips. Sub cut

(2) 4 ½" x 70 ½" top and bottom outer border strips.

Finished size of Log Cabin Block: 12", 12 1/2" unfinished

### Instructions:

Log Cabin center:

1. Sew the sides of Fabric F 1  $1/2" \times 17/8"$  rectangle and A 1  $7/8" \times 17/8"$  square together. Sew a Fabric K 1  $1/2" \times 27/8"$  rectangle to the right side as shown in Diagram 1

2. Sew a Fabric E 1 1/2'' x 2 7/8'' rectangle to the top of Diagram 1. Sew a Fabric D 1 1/2'' x 4" rectangle to the left side of the unit. See Diagram 2 above



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3. Continue in a counterclockwise manner, sewing a Fabric I 1 1/2" x 4" rectangle to the bottom, a Fabric G 1 1/2" x 5" to the right side, a Fabric J 1 1/2" x 5" rectangle to the top and a Fabric C 1 1/2" x 6" rectangle to the left side of the log cabin block to finish. See diagram 3 below. Square to 6"


Repeat to make 25 log cabin units. Set aside.



## 4 patch block segments:

- 1. Sew a Fabric A and G 1 ½" x WOF strip together lengthwise to make a 2 strip panel. Press seam to the dark fabric. Make 10 panels.
- 2. Crosscut the panels into 1 ½" segments for a total of (256) 1 ½" x 2 ½" segments.
- 3. Sew two segments together to make a 4-patch unit. See Diagram 4. Make (128) 4 patch units.

### Corner units A:

- 1. Sew a Fabric B 2 7/8" and Fabric C 2 7/8" triangle together on the long sides to make an HST unit. Make a total of 128 HST units. Square to 2 1/2"
- 2. Sew an HST unit to the right side of a 4 patch unit. Repeat to make (128) HST/4 patch combo units.

Sew (2) combo units together to make a new block segment A. Repeat to make 64 Segments A →

4. Sew the long side of a Fabric H 5 1/4" triangle to the right and bottom edge of Segment A as shown to make a Corner Unit A. Repeat to make (64) Corner Unit A's.

See diagramn 5. Set aside (34) units. You will have (30) remaining corner units

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#### Corner Units B:

1. Take the (30) remaining Corner Units A, and sew the short side of a Fabric B 5 1/4" triangle to the short sides of the Fabric H triangles as shown.

Make 30.

## Making Block A: (Center blocks)


- 1. Sew a Corner unit A to the opposite sides of a log cabin unit as shown in Diagram 7. Repeat to make (9).
- 2. Sew a Corner unit B to opposite sides of the blocks to complete Block A. See Diagram 8. Repeat to make (9) Blocks A.

#### Corner Units C:

Sew the long side of a Fabric H triangle to two adjacent sides of a Fabric B 4 ½" square. Make 36. Set aside (16) Corner Units C. See Diagram 9.

#### Corner Unit D:

Take the remaining (20) Corner Units C, and sew to the short side of a Fabric B 5 1/4" triangle to both short sides of the Fabric H 5 1/4" triangle as shown.

See Diagram 10. This will make (20) Corner Units D.

#### Making Block B. (Side blocks)

1. Sew the blue triangle side of a Corner unit C to the Fabric C side of a log cabin unit. Sew a Corner Unit A to the opposite side as shown in Diagram 11.

2. Sew a Corner Unit B to the bottom left side of the block, and a Corner unit D to the right side of the block as shown. Make 12.

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## Making Block C. (Corner blocks)

1. Sew the blue triangle side of a Corner unit C to the Fabric J side of a log cabin unit. Sew a Corner Unit A to the opposite side as shown in Diagram 12.

2. Sew a Corner Unit D to the remaining two sides to complete



## Assembling the Quilt:

- 1. Sew together (3) horizontal rows of 3 Blocks A. Sew rows together from top to bottom to make the quilt center.
- 2. Sew (3) Blocks B together in a horizontal row. Make 4 rows. Rotate two rows and sew to quilt sides as shown.
- 3. Sew a Block C to both ends of the remaining (2) Block B rows (make sure the corner blocks are rotated correctly). Sew them to the top and bottom of the quilt.





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#### Inner Border:

- 1. Sew the Fabric A 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips to the sides of the quilt.
- 2. Sew the Fabric A 1 ½" x 62 ½" strips to the top and bottom of the quilt.

#### Outer Border:

- 1. Sew the Fabric K 4 ½" x 62 ½" strips to the sides of the quilt.
- 2. Sew the Fabric K 4 ½" x 70 ½" strips to the top and bottom of the quilt.

Layer quilt, quilt as desired and bind using the Fabric C 2 1/2" strips.

Finished size of the quilt is 70" x 70"
