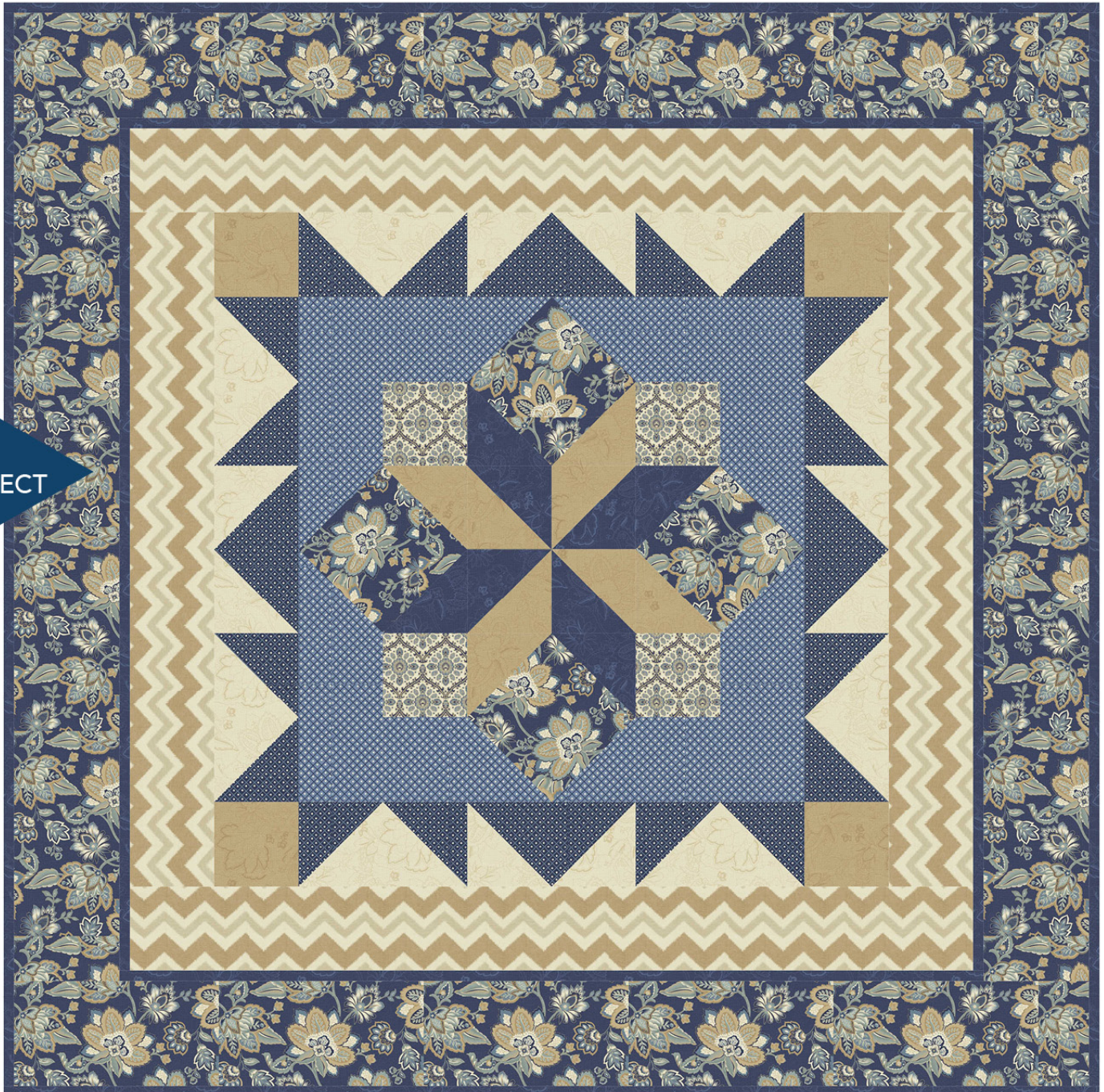

KEY	FABRIC	SKU	YD	CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS
A		42059-5 Tan	1/4	(1) 4 7/8" x 42" strip; cut into (4) 4 7/8" squares, cut once on diagonal. Trim remaining strip down to 4 1/2" wide; cut (4) 4 1/2" squares.
B		42059-3 Cream	3/8	(1) 9 1/4" x 42" strip; cut into (2) 9 1/4" squares, cut twice on diagonal. Trim remaining strip down to 4 7/8" wide; cut (4) 4 7/8" squares, cut once on diagonal.
C		42057-1 Dark Blue	1/2	(1) 9 1/4" x 9 1/4" square (1) 4 7/8" x 42" strip, cut into (8) 4 7/8" squares, cut twice on diagonal
D		42057-2 Light Blue	3/8	(1) 4 7/8" x 42" strip; cut into (4) 4 7/8" squares, cut once on diagonal. Trim remaining strip down to 4 1/2" wide; cut (4) 4 1/2" squares. (1) 4 1/2" x 42" strip; cut into (4) 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangles.
E		42056-3 Cream	1/4	(1) 4 1/2" x 42" strip; cut into (4) 4 1/2" squares.
F		42059-1 Dark Blue	3/4	(1) 4 7/8" x 42" strip; cut into (4) 4 7/8" squares, cut once on diagonal. (4) 1" x 42" strips. Sew end to end and cut into (2) 1" x 40 1/2" side borders, and (2) 1" x 41 1/2" top and bottom borders. (6) 2 1/2" x 42" Binding strips.
G		42055-1 Dark Blue	1-1/8	(1) 6 1/8" x 42" strip; cut into (4) 6 1/8" squares. (5) 5 1/2" x 42" strips. Sew end to end and cut into (2) 5 1/2" x 41 1/2" side borders, and (2) 5 1/2" x 51 1/2" top and bottom borders.
H		42058-3 Cream	1-1/4	(4) 4 1/2" x 42" strips; cut into (2) 4 1/2" x 32 1/2" side borders and (2) 4 1/2" x 40 1/2" top and bottom borders. Cut on the LOF (Length of Fabric)
		Backing	3-3/8	



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Block Assembly: 32 1/2" unfinished.

1. Sew a Fabric D 4 1/2" square to the left side of a Fabric E 4 1/2" square →
2. Sew a Fabric D 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangle to the top as shown.



Square up to 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" unfinished.

← Step 2.

3. Sew the long side of a Fabric C 4-7/8" triangle to both short sides of a Fabric B 9 1/4" triangle to make a Flying Geese #1 unit as shown. Make 2 →

Square up to 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" unfinished.



4. Sew a Flying Geese unit to the left side of the Step 2 unit.

5. Sew a Fabric A 4 1/2" square to the left side of the remaining Flying Geese unit.
6. Sew the unit in Step 5 to the top of the unit in Step 4 to complete a Corner unit. Repeat Steps 1-6 to make a total of (4) Corner Units. Set aside.

Square up to 12 1/2" unfinished.
Completed Corner Unit →
Make 4.



7. Sew the long side of a Fabric D 4 7/8" triangle to (2) adjacent sides of a Fabric G 6 1/8" square as shown →





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8. Sew the long sides of a Fabric F 4 7/8" triangle to the bottom left, and a Fabric A 4 7/8" triangle to the bottom right of the unit in Step 7 to complete the Square in a Square Unit. Repeat to make 4.



Square up to 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" unfinished

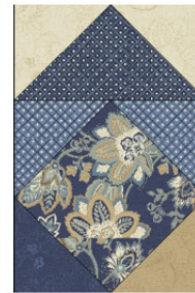

9. Sew the long sides of a Fabric B 4 7/8" triangle to both short sides of a Fabric C 9 1/4" triangle to make a Flying Geese #2 Unit. Square up to 4 1/2" x 8 1/2". Make 4.

10. Sew to the top of the Square in a Square Unit as shown →
Repeat to make 4.



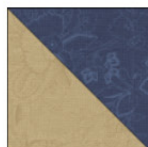
11. Sew a completed Corner Unit to both sides of the Square in a Square Unit with the Flying Geese #2 attached. This makes Row 1 of the block. Be sure to rotate the Corner Unit on the right end as shown.

Make 2



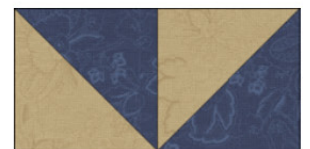
12. Sew the long side of a Fabric A and Fabric F 4 7/8" triangle together to make a Half Square Triangle.

Square to 4-1/2"
Make 4.



13. Sew (2) Half Square Triangles together into a 2-patch unit as shown →

Make 2.





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14. Rotate and sew one 2-patch unit to the bottom of the first to make a Pinwheel Unit.

Square up to 8 1/2" unfinished.

Pinwheel Unit →



15. Sew a rotated Square in a Square Unit with the Flying Geese unit attached to both sides of the Pinwheel Unit to make Row 2 of the block.

Row 2 →



16. Sew Row 1 to the top of Row 2. Rotate and sew the remaining Row 1 to the bottom of the block to complete the block.

Square up to 32 1/2" unfinished.

Borders

1. Sew the Fabric H 4 1/2" x 32 1/2" strips to the sides of the center block. Sew the Fabric H 4 1/2" x 40 1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the block. See quilt image.
2. Sew the Fabric F 1" x 40 1/2" strips to the sides of the quilt. Sew the Fabric F 1" x 41 1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the quilt. See quilt image.
3. Sew the Fabric G 5 1/2" x 41 1/2" strips to the sides of the quilt. Sew the Fabric G 5 1/2" x 51 1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the quilt. See quilt image.

Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; quilt as desired. Using the Fabric F 2 1/2" strips, bind the edges to finish.
