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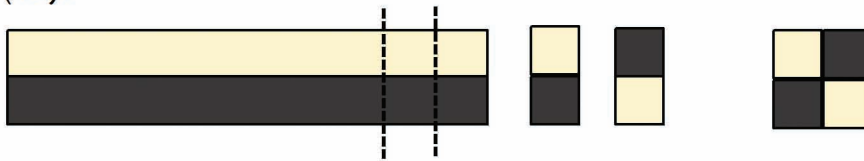
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Piecing Instructions

Block 1:

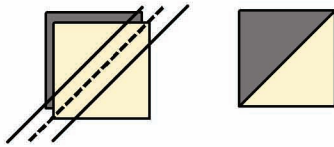
4 Patch units:

1. Sew (1) E 2-1/2" X WOF strip and (1) F 2-1/2" X WOF strip together along the long edge. Make (6) EF strips, then press with seam allowance towards the E fabric.
2. Subcut EF strips into (96) 2-1/2" X 4-1/2" rectangles.
3. Sew (2) 2-1/2" X 4-1/2" rectangles together to create a 4 patch unit. Square to 4-1/2". Make (48).



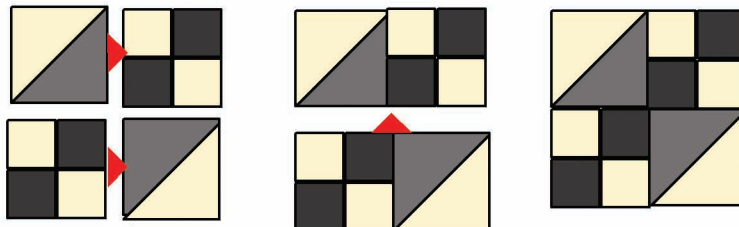
Half Square Triangle units:

4. Take (1) 5" C square and (1) 5" F square and place right sides together. Draw diagonal line on wrong side of F square, then sew seam 1/4" on both sides of drawn line.
5. Cut on drawn line, then press the (2) half square triangles (HST) open with the seam allowance towards C fabric. Square to 4-1/2". Repeat to make (48) HST units.



Construct blocks:

6. Following diagram – sew together (2) 4 patch units and (2) HST units.
7. Square to 8 1/2", Make (24) Block 1.

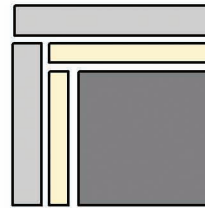


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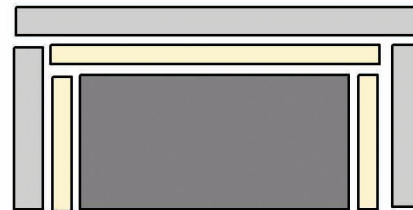
Block 2:

1. Sew (1) F 1-1/4" X 6-1/2" strip to the left side of (1) A 6-1/2" square, then sew (1) F 1-1/4" X 7-1/4" strip to the top.
2. Sew (1) D 1-3/4" X 7-1/4" to the left side, then sew (1) D 1-3/4" X 8-1/2" strip to the top to complete Block 2.
3. Square to 8-1/2", make (8).



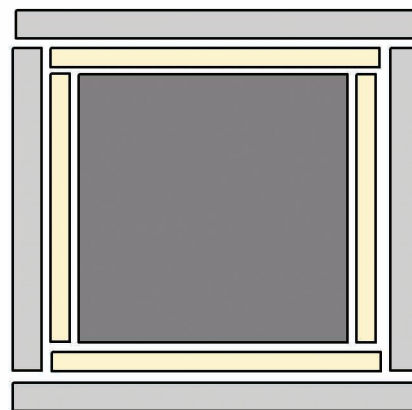
Block 3:

4. Sew (2) F 1-1/4" X 6-1/2" strips to the sides of (1) A 6-1/2" X 12-1/2" rectangle, then sew (1) F 1-1/4" X 14" strip to the top.
5. Sew (2) D 1-3/4" X 7-1/4" to the sides, then sew (1) D 1-3/4" X 16-1/2" strip to the top to complete Block 3.
6. Square to 8-1/2" X 16-1/2", make (4).



Block 4:

7. Sew (2) F 1-1/4" X 12-1/2" strips to the sides of (1) A" X 12-1/2" square, then sew (2) F 1-1/4" X 14" strips to the top and bottom.
8. Sew (2) D 1-3/4" X 14" to the sides, then sew (2) D 1-3/4" X 16-1/2" strips to the top and bottom to complete Block 4. Square to 16-1/2", make (1).

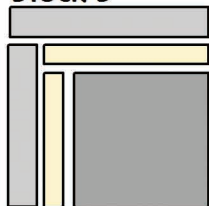


Blocks 5, 6, 7 and 8:

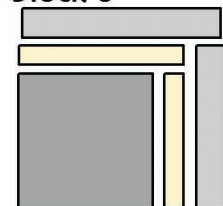
(NOTE: Fabric B is directional, refer to diagrams for proper orientation of text)

9. Sew (1) F 1-1/4" X 6-1/2" strip to the left side of (1) B 6-1/2" square, then sew (1) F 1-1/4" X 7-1/4" strip to the top.
10. Sew (1) D 1-3/4" X 7-1/4" to the left side, then sew (1) D 1-3/4" X 8-1/2" strip to the top to complete Block 5. Square to 8-1/2", make (1).
11. Repeat 15 and 16, sewing F and D strips to right side and top to create Block 6, make (1).
12. Repeat 15 and 16, sewing F and D strips to left side and bottom to create Block 7, make (1).
13. Repeat 15 and 16, sewing F and D strips to right side and bottom to create Block 8, make (1).

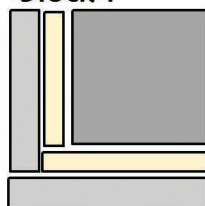

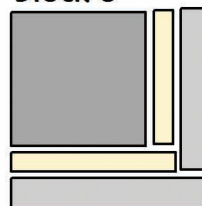

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Assembly Instructions

Quilt Assembly: (Refer to cover image for proper placement and rotation of blocks)

Version 1

1. Sew (2) Block 1 together to create Block 1 Pair for Row 4 below, make (2).
2. Sew the following blocks together into rows, then sew rows together.
ROWS 1, 7: Block 1 – Block 2 – Block 1 – Block 1 - Block 2 – Block 1
ROWS 2, 6: Block 2 – Block 1 – Block 3 – Block 1 – Block 2
ROW 3: Block 1 – Block 5 – Block 1 – Block 1 - Block 6 – Block 1
ROW 4: Block 3 – Block 1 Pair – Block 4 – Block 1 Pair – Block 3
ROW 5: Block 1 – Block 7 – Block 1 – Block 1 - Block 8 – Block 1

Version 2

Adjust the orientation of the blocks to match the picture on the cover.

Border Assembly:

3. Border #1: Sew (6) 1-1/2" F strips together via the short ends using a straight seam. Measure sides of quilt (ours is 64-1/2"), cut (2) strips and sew to sides of quilt. Measure top and bottom (ours is 50-1/2), cut (2) strips and sew to top and bottom of quilt.
4. Border #2: Sew (6) 6-1/2" C strips together via the short ends using a straight seam. Measure top and bottom of quilt (ours is 50-1/2"), cut (2) strips to fit, then sew (1) 6-1/2" A square to each end of strip and set aside. Measure sides of quilt (ours is 66-1/2"), cut (2) strips and sew to sides of quilt. Then sew ACA strips to top and bottom of quilt.

Finishing:

Backing and batting should be 8" larger than finished quilt top. Layer your backing, batting and quilt top, then quilt as desired. Bind using your preferred method ... and enjoy!
