

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

25029 Ivory	1 3/4 yards
35362P-3 Brown	3/8 yard
40785-4 Coral	1/4 yard
40781-1 Gold	1/4 yard
40785-2 Teal	1/4 yard
40781-3 Brown	1/4 yard
40783-4 Coral	1/8 yard
40783-1 Gold	1/8 yard
40784-2 Teal	1/8 yard
40784-4 Coral	1/8 yard
35 35 35 35 40785-6 Cream	1/4 yard

Fabric	Quantity Needed
Backing	3 yards
Binding ::: 35362P-3 Brown	1/2 yard

Before You Begin:

- Read through all directions first
- All seam allowances are a scant 1/4"
- RST stands for "Right Sides Together"
- WOF stands for "Width of Fabric"
- Fabric requirement assumes 40" between selvages
- Extra fabric will be required if using directional prints or if pre-washing your fabric

Cutting Instructions

Ivory 25029

- Cut (3) 3 1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut each strip into (6) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles. You will only use (16) of the rectangles.
- Cut (2) 3 1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut each strip into (11) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares. You will only use (16) of the squares.
- Cut (2) 4" x WOF strips, sub-cut each into (9) 4" x 4" squares. You will only use (16) of the squares.

Brown 35362P-3

Cut (3) 3 1/2" x WOF strips, sub-cut each strip into (11) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares. You will only use (32) of the squares.

Coral 40785-4

- Cut (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip, cut (4) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.
- Cut (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip, cut (8) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares.

Gold 40781-1

- Cut (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip, cut (4) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.
- Cut (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip, cut (8) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares.

Teal 40785-2

- Cut (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip, cut (4) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.
- Cut (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip, cut (8) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares.

Brown 40781-3

- Cut (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip, cut (4) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.
- Cut (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip, cut (8) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares.

Coral 40783-4

Cut (1) 4" x WOF strip, cut (4) 4" x 4" squares.

Gold 40783-1

Cut (1) 4" x WOF strip, cut (4) 4" x 4" squares.

Teal 40784-2

Cut (1) 4" x WOF strip, cut (4) 4" x 4" squares.

Coral 40784-4

Cut (1) 4" x WOF strip, cut (4) 4" x 4" squares.

Cream 40785-6

Cut (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip, cut (4) 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" squares.

Cutting Instructions (Borders):



Piecing The HST (Half Square Triangles):

- 1. Take (1) 4" x 4" Coral 40783-4 square and (1) 4" x 4" Ivory 25029 square and place them RST.
- 2. With a pencil, mark a diagonal line from one corner to the next.
- 3. Sew a scant 1/4" away from the pencil line on both sides as shown in the diagram.
- 4. Cut on the line, separating the two halves; which now creates 2 HST (Half Square Triangles).
- 5. Repeat the steps above using the following fabric combinations to yield all of the HST needed for this quilt. If using directional fabric, pay attention to the direction in which the diagonal line is heading.
 - o Combine (1) Coral 40783-4 square and (1) Ivory 25029 square. Repeat for a total of 8 HST.
 - o Combine (1) Gold 40783-1 square and (1) Ivory 25029 square. Repeat for a total of 8 HST.
 - o Combine (1) Teal 40784-2 square and (1) Ivory 25029 square. Repeat for a total of 8 HST.
 - o Combine (1) Coral 40784-4 square and (1) Ivory 25029 square. Repeat for a total of 8 HST.








Piecing The Flying Geese:

- 1. Take (2) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Coral 40785-4 squares and lightly mark a diagonal line on the wrong side. This is the sewing line.
- 2. Following the diagram, sew (1) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Coral 40785-4 square to (1) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Ivory 25029 rectangle RST on the diagonal line drawn in Step 1. Leaving a 1/4" seam allowance, cut off the excess fabric and press the remaining triangle shape open. Repeat for the other 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Coral 40785-4 square until you have a finished Flying Geese Block.
- 3. Repeat Steps 1 & 2 until you have completed (4) Flying Geese blocks.
- 4. Using the 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares you cut out in the other fabrics Gold 40781-1, Teal 40785-2, and Brown 40781-3 repeat Steps 1-2 so you have (4) finished Flying Geese blocks of each.




Piecing The Center Block:

- 1. Take (4) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Brown 35362P-3 squares and lightly mark a diagonal line on the wrong side. This is the sewing line.
- 2. Following the diagram, sew (1) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Brown 35362P-3 square RST to the corner of (1) 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" Cream 40785-6 square. Leaving a 1/4" seam allowance, cut off the excess fabric and press the remaining triangle shape open.
- 3. Repeat Step 2 for the remaining (3) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Brown 35362P-3 squares until you have a completed Center Block.
- 4. Make a total of (4) completed Center Blocks.



Laying Out The Blocks:

- Following the diagram, lay out the HST and Flying Geese blocks; add in the 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles and the 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"squares as shown.
- Sew the pieces RST one row at a time. Press.
- Repeat the steps above until all rows are finished.
- · Sew the rows RST. Press.





Sewing The Quilt Top & Adding Borders:

- 1. Following the diagram, lay out the blocks as shown. Sew the blocks RST. Press.
- 2. Prepare the borders by taking (2) 6 1/2" x WOF lengths and sew them RST along the short side. Repeat one more times to create the left and right borders of the quilt.
- 3. Start by sewing one of the lengths to the right side of the quilt top, and another to the left side of the quilt top. Press and square up the borders.
- 4. Take (1) 6 1/2" x WOF length and cut it in half, creating (2) 6 1/2" x 20" lengths.
- 5. Take (1) 6 1/2" x WOF length and sew it to (1) of the 6 1/2" x 20" lengths. Press. This will be the top border.
- 6. Repeat Step 5 to create the bottom border.
- 7. Sew the top and bottom borders onto the quilt top. Press.



Finishing The Quilt:

- Due to the size of the quilt, you will need to piece the back. Please be sure to leave a minimum of 4" excess on all sides for ease of quilting.
- · Press your quilt top and backing, so they are wrinkle-free and flat.
- Layer your quilt top, batting and backing.
- Baste.
- Quilt as desired.
- · Bind the quilt using your favorite method.
