



А		41984-3 Cream	2-5/8	Block 1: (4) 4-7/8" x 42" strips; cut into (30) 4-7/8" squares, cut once on diagonal. (5) 2-7/8" x 42" strips; cut into (60) 2 7/8" squares, cut once on diagonal. Block 2: (4) 4 7/8" x 42" strips; cut into (30) 4-7/8" squares, cut once on diagonal. (7) 4 ½" x 42" strips; cut into (60) 4 ½" squares.
В		41985-4 Gold	1/4	Block 2: (1) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42" strip; cut into (8) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut twice on diagonal (use 30 triangles).
С		41982-2 Celedon	1-3/4	Block 2: (4) 4-7/8" x 42" strips; cut into (30) 4-7/8" squares, cut once on diagonal. Outer Border: (7) 5 $1/2$ " x 42" strips: Sew end to end and cut (2) 5 $1/2$ " x 72 $1/2$ " side borders, and (2) 5 $1/2$ " x 70 $1/2$ " top and bottom borders.
D		41987-4 Gold	1/4	Block 2: (1) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42" strip; cut into (8) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut twice on diagonal (use 30 triangles).
Е		41983-2 Celedon	5/8	Block 1: (4) 4 ½" x 42" strips; cut into (30) 4 ½" squares.
F		41982-1 Navy	5/8	Block 1: (4) 4 ½" x 42" strips; cut into (30) 4 ½" squares.
G		41984-2 Celedon	3/8	Block 1: (3) 2-7/8" x 42" strip; cut into (30) 2-7/8" squares. Cut once on diagonal.
Н		41985-1 Navy	1/2	Block 1: (5) 2-7/8" x 42" strips; cut into (60) 2-7/8" squares, cut once on diagonal.
ı		41988-4 Gold	3/8	Block 1: (2) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 42" strip; cut into (15) 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, cut twice on diagonal.
J		41986-1 Navy	5/8	(8) 2 ½" x 42" Binding strips.


Block Assembly:

Block 1:





2. Rotate one unit in Step 1 and sew to the bottom of the first unit in Step 1 to make a 4 patch unit.



3. Fold a Fabric I triangle in half, crease with finger along the base of the triangle. Place the crease, right sides together onto opposite sides of the 4 patch unit, matching the crease to the seam line. Sew a ¼" seam all the way across the triangle base. Repeat on all four sides. You will get an odd looking shape like this in Diagram 1. Press to the gold triangles.


- 4. Draw a line with a straight ruler from two Fabric I triangle points. Use the ruler and your rotary cutter to cut off the excess points of the 4 patch unit. See Diagram 2. Set aside.
- 5. Sew the short side of a Fabric H 2 7/8" triangle to both short sides of a Fabric G 2 7/8" triangle as shown in Diagram 3→
- 6. Sew the base of a Fabric A $\overline{47/8}$ " triangle to the top of the unit in Diagram 3. \rightarrow
- 7. Sew the short sides of a Fabric A 2 7/8" triangle to both sides of the Fabric H triangles in the unit in Step 6 to complete the Pieced Triangle Section. Repeat to make 4 units in Steps 5-7.





8. Sew the base of the Pieced Triangle Section to all four sides of the block in Diagram 2. This completes Block 1. Repeat to make 15. Square up to 12.5"







9. Sew a Fabric A and C 4-7/8" triangle together on long diagonal side to make a half square triangle (HST).

Make 4



Sq to 4-1/2"

10. Sew the Fabric C side of a HST in Step 9 to both sides of a Fabric A 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square as shown. Make 2.



11. Sew the short sides of a Fabric B and D 5 ¼" quarter square triangle together to make a pieced triangle. Make 2

12. Rotate and sew one of the pieced triangles to the other at the base of the pieced triangle to make a square as shown \rightarrow

Sq to 4-1/2"

13. Sew a Fabric A 4 ½" square to both sides of the unit in Step 12 \rightarrow



14. Sew a unit in Step 10 to the top of the center unit in Step 12. Rotate and sew the remaining unit from Step 10 to the bottom of the block to complete Block 2. Repeat Steps 9-14 to make 15 blocks.

Quilt Assembly:

15. The quilt center is made of 6 horizontal rows of 5 blocks each. Blocks 1 and 2 are alternated in each row, starting and ending with Block 2 in Row 1. It will have (3) Block 2's and (2) Block 1's. Repeat to make Rows 3 and 5.



← Rows 1, 3 and 5.



16. Blocks 1 and 2 are alternated in this row, starting and ending with Block 1 in Row 2. It will have (3) Block 1's and (2) Block 2's. Repeat to make Rows 2 and 4.



← Rows 2, 4, and 6

17. Sew Rows 1-6 together in order from top to bottom with horizontal seams to complete the quilt center.

Outer Border:

- 18. Sew a Fabric C 5 ½" x 72 ½" strip to both sides of the quilt.
- 19. Sew a Fabric C 5 ½" x 70 ½" strip to the top and bottom of the quilt.

Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; quilt as desired. Using the Fabric J $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips, bind the edges to finish.
