


ADDITIONAL MATERIALS


Thread to match fabrics Basic sewing supplies For raw edge appliqué: fusible webbing Sewing machine Rotary cutter, ruler and mat For turned edge applique: paper or freezer paper

NOTE: If you choose to use a fusible appliqué technique, place paper-backed fusible webbing rectangle over the cloud pattern. Trace along the solid seamline and along the red dashed line. Cut out the center along the inner line. Fuse the rectangle to the wrong side of the fabric. Cut the cloud out along the outer line. Remove the paper backing and fuse to position on 8-1/2" E squares.











APPLIQUÉ BLOCKS

- 1. Using your favorite appliqué method, prepare the large and small cloud appliqué pieces from fabric I.
- 2. Position the appliqué clouds on the E 8-1/2" squares and sew them in place. Blocks should measure 12-1/2" square including seam allowance. Make 5 of each.
- 3. Cut out the background fabric behind the clouds along the inner edge of the zigzag machine appliqué or about 3/16" from the hand stitching so background does not show through white fabric clouds.

PATCHWORK BLOCKS

4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (20) C, (10) H and (10) **J** 3-1/8" squares.







5. Lay (1) **J** 3-1/8" on the lower right corner of (1) **B** 4-1/2" square with right sides togethernoting orientation of larger square. Sew along the drawn line. Trim the fabric 1/4" from the stitching as indicated by the solid line. Press the J piece open to complete the square unit.

- 7. In the same way, sew (1) C 3-1/8" square to the lower left corner of (1) B 4-1/2" square and (1) **E** 4-1/2" square. Make the indicated number.
- 8. In the same way, sew (1) C 3-1/8" square to the upper right corner of (1) A 4-1/2" square and (1) **E** 4-1/2" square. Make the indicated number.
- 9. In the same way, sew (1) H 3-1/8" square to the upper left corner of (1) A 4-1/2" square and (1) **E** 4-1/2" square. Make the indicated number.















10. Sew the square units together in pairs matching the seams as shown.


11. Sew the square unit pairs together to make Blocks 1 and 2. Blocks should measure 8-1/2" square including seam allowance. Make the indicated number.












QUILT ASSEMBLY

12. Sew (5) 1-1/4" x 8-1/2 **H** strips alternating with (1) small cloud block, (1) Block 2, (1) large cloud block, and (1) Block 2 to make Row 1. Make 3.

13. Sew (5) \mathbf{H} 1-1/4" x 8-1/2 strips alternating with (1) Block 1, (1) large cloud block, (1) Block 1 and (1) small cloud block, to make Row 2. Make 2.

14. Sew (5) **J** 1-1/4" squares alternating with (4) **H** 1-1/4" \times 8-1/2 strips to make sashing rows. Make 6.



15. Following the layout diagram on page 5, sew the sashing strips and block rows 1 and 2 together matching seams.

BORDERS

- **16.** Sew (1) **D** 1-1/2" x 45" border to sides of quilt. Sew (1) **C** 1-1/2" square to both ends of (2) **D** 1-1/2" x 36-1/4" borders. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.
- **17.** Sew (1) \mathbf{A} 4-1/2" x 47" borders to sides of quilt. Sew (1) \mathbf{A} 4-1/2" x 46-1/4" border to top and bottom of quilt.
- **18.** Sew (1) **F** 1-1/2" x 55" border to sides of quilt. Sew (1) **C** 1-1/2" square to both ends of (2) **F** 1-1/2" x 46-1/4" borders. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.

FINISHING: Layer quilt top, batting and backing together to form quilt sandwich. Baste and quilt as desired. Bind using **J** 2-1/4" strips.
