A		White Solid	1 3/4	Strips 1 and 15: (4) 2 1/2" x WOF. Piece strips and subcut (2) 2 1/2" x 72 1/2" strips. Strips 3 and 13: (4) 2" x WOF. Piece strips and subcut (2) 2" x 72 1/2" strips. Strips 2 and 14: (8) 4 1/2" x WOF. Subcut (72) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" squares.




Constructing Flying Geese Units

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (1) 4 $1/2" \times 4 1/2"$ **A** square. Place square, right sides together, at a corner of (1) 4 $1/2" \times 6 1/2"$ <fabric 1> rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal white solid corner triangle.

Repeat with another 4 $1/2" \times 4 1/2"$ <fabric 2> square at the diagonally opposite corner on the same fabric 1 rectangle.




Repeat to make a mirror-imaged unit.





2. Sew both units together to complete (1) flying geese blocks, measuring 4 1/2" x 12 1/2" raw

edge to raw edge.



3. Make a total number of flying geese blocks in the combinations A / fabric 1 / fabric 2 :

10 blocks: A/F/B

8 blocks: A/G/I, A/F/C

6 blocks: A/G/J 4 blocks: A/G/H

4. Refer to quilt image, arrange and sew together flying geese blocks to make a pieced column. Repeat to make (2) identical pieced columns.

Quilt Top Assembly

Note: Quilt top is constructed by vertical strips from left to right.

Strip 1: (1) 2 1/2" x 72 1/2" A strip

Strip 2: (1) pieced flying geese column

Strip 3: (1) 2" x 72 1/2" **A** strip

Strip 4: (1) 4 1/2" x 72 1/2" **D** strip

Strip 5: (1) 2" x 72 1/2" I strip

Strip 6: (1) 1 1/2" x 72 1/2" **F** strip

Strip 7: (1) 1" x 72 1/2" | strip

Strip 8: (1) 14 1/2" x 72 1/2" **E** strip

Strip 9: (1) 1" x 72 1/2" I strip

Strip 10: (1) 1 1/2" x 72 1/2" **F** strip

Strip 11: (1) 2" x 72 1/2" I strip


Strip 12: (1) 4 1/2" x 72 1/2" **D** strip

Strip 13: (1) 2" x 72 1/2" A strip

Strip 14: (1) pieced flying geese column

Strip 15: (1) 2 1/2" x 72 1/2" A strip





Finishing

Layer quilt top, batting and backing together. Baste and quilt as desired. Attach binding to complete quilt.
