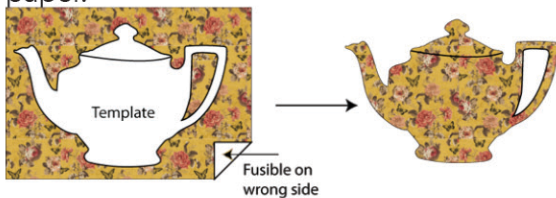
Tea Cozy

KEY	FABRIC	SKU	YD	
A		42825-3	7" x 10"	For Tea Pot Appliqué
B		42829-4	2-1/2" strip	For Binding
C		42828-2	1/3	Main cozy fabric
D		42826-4	1/3	Inside cozy fabric
				(2) 10" x 12" pieces of thin cotton batting
				(1) 10" x 7" piece of paper backed fusible webbing AND freezer paper

Getting Started

Step 1. Pre-wash and iron all fabrics. Press all seams as you sew. Use 1/4" seam allowances.

Step 2. Transfer the markings of the Teapot Template to freezer paper. Iron the freezer paper to the right side of Fabric A. Iron the fusible web to the wrong side of the Fabric A, taking care to keep any stray fusible web away from the hot iron. Use a pressing cloth between the iron and the fabrics and another between the fabrics and the ironing board cover. Cut out teapot. Remove freezer paper.



Step 3. Cut out (2) 9" x 11-1/2" rectangles each from Fabric C, Fabric D and the cotton batting.

Sewing

Step 4. Remove the fusible webbing paper from the Tea Pot appliqué, center it over one of the Fabric C pieces and iron in place. Stitch to secure using your favorite machine or hand appliqué method. If desired, also stitch the horizontal curved line that separates the tea pot from its lid. This is the Tea Cozy front.

Step 5. Layer the Tea Cozy front, one of the cotton batting pieces and one of the lining pieces, just as you would layer a quilt sandwich. Baste the layers together. Repeat for the Tea Cozy back with the remaining piece of cotton batting and the remaining lining piece.

Quilting

Step 6. Machine quilt each sandwich separately with a meandering pattern.

Step 7. Use the full size tea cozy template and cut out both front and back pieces. This gives the top and sides the curved edge.



Finishing & Binding

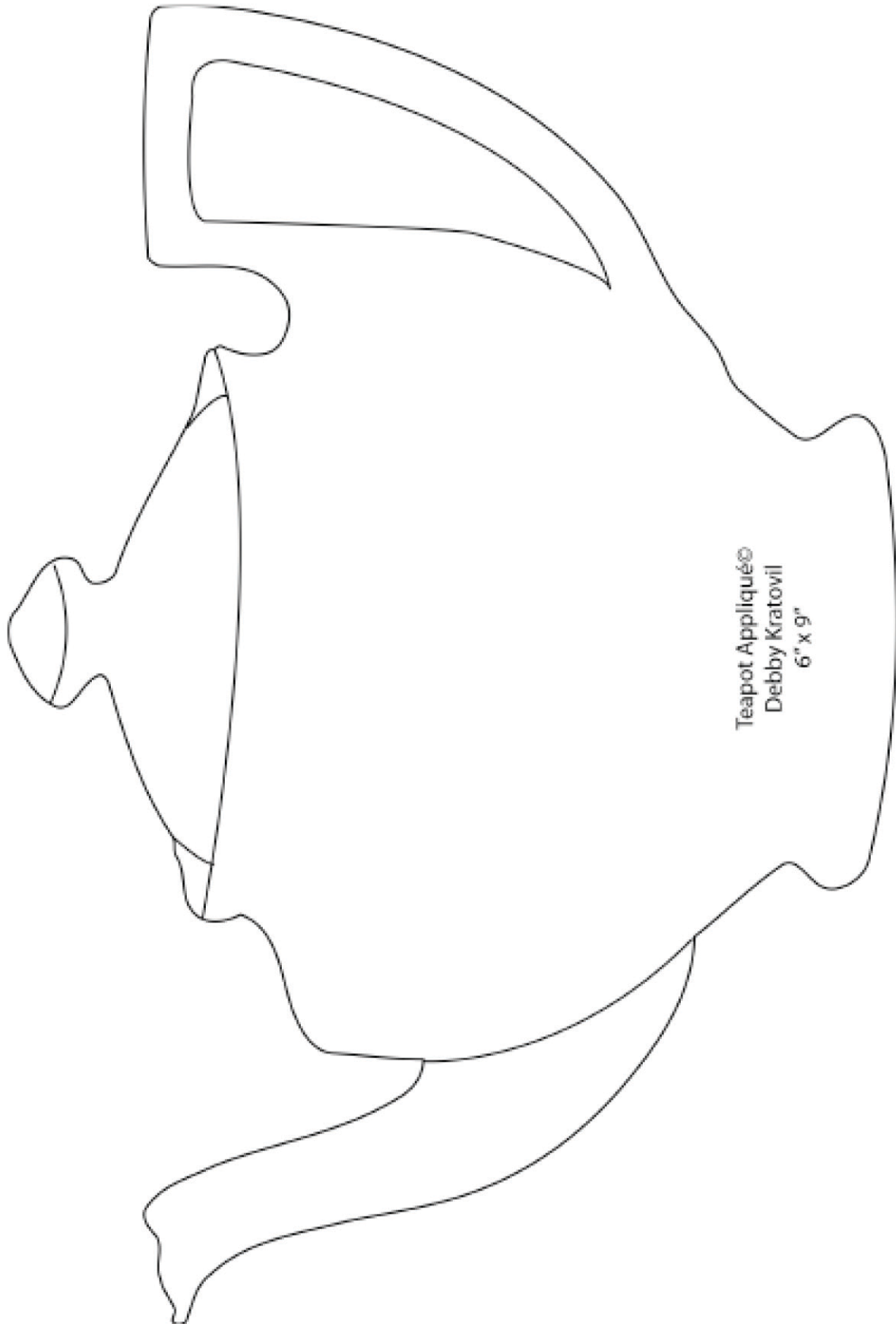
Step 8. Place the Tea Cozy front and back, right sides together, and stitch along the entire curved edge using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seam allowance open along the sides. Turn Tea Cozy right side out.

Step 9. Fold the 2-1/2" x 42" Fabric B strip in half lengthwise and press. Pin and sew raw edges of binding strip to raw edges of Tea Cozy bottom. Turn folded edge to inside and stitch in place to complete the binding.





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
