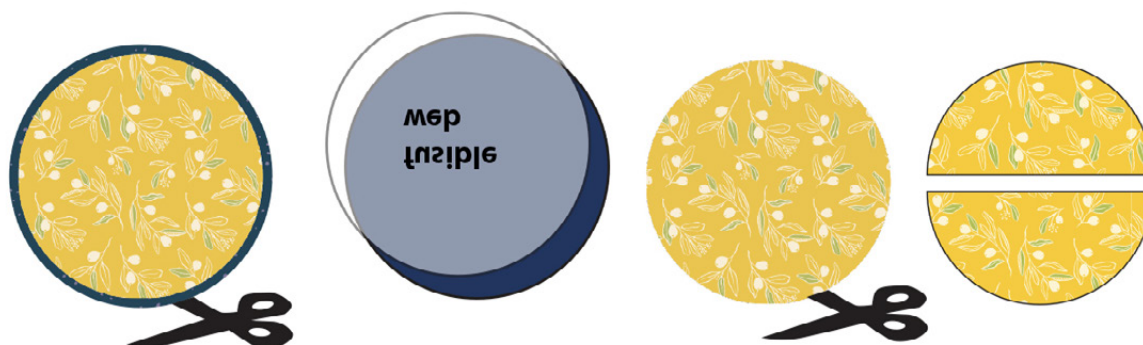

A		53960D-10 Navy	1	(6) large half circles (12) medium half circles (10) small half circles
B		53966-8 Teal	1/2	(4) 3" x WOF strips. Piece strips via short ends and cut (2) 3" x 45" strips and (2) 3" x 17" strips.
C		53967-5 Ivory	2/3	(2) 10" x WOF strips.
D		53967-10 Navy	1/2	(4) 2-1/4" x WOF strips for binding. (3) 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Piece strips via short ends and cut (2) 1-1/2" x 43" strips and (2) 1-1/2" x 12" strips.
		Backing	7/8	21" x 54" piece of batting

**Additional Supplies:** Fusible web for applique, pressing sheet

## PREPARING THE CIRCLES

**NOTE:** The table runner shown uses 14 different half circles. If you use the same fabric placement, you'll have 14 leftover half circles to use in a different project.

**1.** Select which circles you want to use from the **A** print. Cut out each selected circle approximately 1/4" - 1/2" beyond circle edge. Cut fusible web to same size of each circle. Following manufacturer's directions and using a pressing sheet to protect your iron, adhere fusible web to wrong side of each circle shape. Using scissors, cut out each circle shape along printed edge. Using a ruler, cut fusible-backed circles in half.





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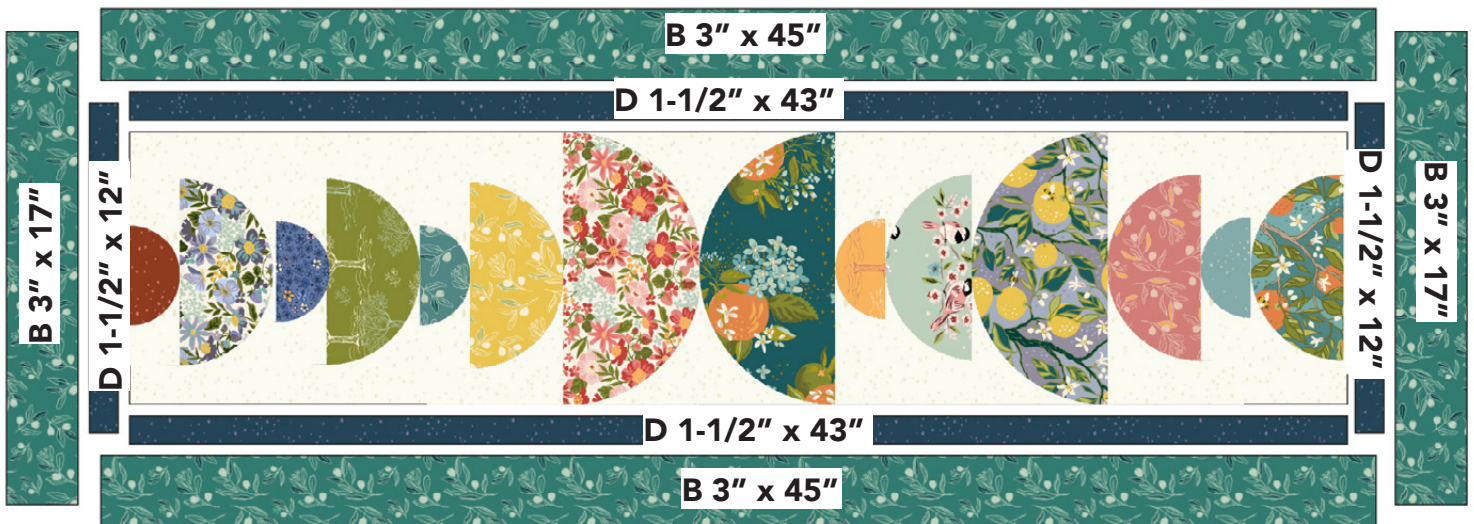
## APPLIQUED STRIP ASSEMBLY

2. Sew (2) **C** 10" x WOF strips together along short ends. Trim strip to measure 43", centering seam.
3. Fold **C** 10" x 43" strip in half lengthwise to find center line and press. Referring to the runner image and the Layout Diagram, lay out the desired half circles. Leave 1/4" seam allowance on all sides of **C** strip. Lightly fold each half circle in half to find center, and align center lines so half circles are centered on the strip. Fuse half circles in place on the strip, aligning with the center line of the **C** strip.
4. Use a zig zag or decorative stitch to secure each half-circle applique in place.

## RUNNER ASSEMBLY

5. **INNER BORDER:** Sew **D** 1-1/2" x 43" strips to opposite sides of the runner center. Sew **D** 1-1/2" x 12" strips to the top and bottom.
6. **OUTER BORDER:** Sew **B** 3" x 45" strips to opposite sides of the runner center. Sew **D** 3" x 17" strips to the top and bottom.

**FINISHING:** Layer runner top, batting and backing together to form quilt sandwich. Baste and quilt as desired. Bind using **D** 2-1/4" x WOF strips.
