


Materials Requirements:

Various Prints: 1 yard of each of 4 prints for blocks (Version 1, 2, 3 shows 39994-2 Purple, 39993-2 Purple, 39992-2 Purple, and 39991-2 Purple - Version 4 shows 39991-1 Blue, 39992-1 Blue, 39993-1 Blue, 39994-1 Blue)

Solid or near solid: 3 yards for blocks (Version 1 shows 37098-12 Chalk, Version 2 shows 37098-36 Grass, Version 3 shows 37098-33 Ocean, Version 4 shows 37098-15 Salmon)

Additional print fabric(s): 5 yards for pieced backing

Additional fabric: 1 yard for bias binding (Version 1, 2, 3 shows 39994-2 Purple, Version 4 shows

39991-1 Blue) Batting: 68" X 88"



Cutting instructions:

1. From each print fabric, cut (36) 5 1/2" squares (144 squares total)

2. From solid fabric, cut (144) 5 1/2" squares

Cut and piece the Drunkard's Path units:


1. Use the Wedge template to cut Wedge Units from (48) solid 5 1/2" squares and (12) 5 1/2" squares of each print fabric (48 print Wedges, total).

2. Use the Arc template to cut Arc Units from (48) solid 5 1/2" squares and (12) 5 1/2" squares of each print fabric (48 print Arcs, total).

3. Match each print Wedge with a solid Arc, and each solid Wedge with a print Arc.

4. With right sides together, pin Arc and Wedge units together along the curved edges, matching raw edges.


5. Stitch along curve using a 1/4" seam to make (96) Drunkard's Path units. If needed, trim each unit to measure 5 1/2" square. (Diagram 1)



Piece the Ogee Blocks:

Note: The quilt shown constructs each Ogee Block from units in a single print. If you prefer a scrappier look, you may mix prints within each Ogee Block.

1. Piece Row A from (2) Drunkard's Path units with solid Wedges and (2) solid 5 1/2" squares; piece (2) Rows A for each Ogee Block. (Diagram 2)






2. Piece Row B from (2) Drunkard's Path units with print Wedges and (2) print 5 1/2" squares; piece (2) Rows B for each Ogee Block. (Diagram 3)



3. Lay out each set of (2) Rows A and (2) Rows B as shown; stitch together along long edges to complete (1) Ogee Block. (Diagram 4)




4. Repeat with remaining units to create (12) Ogee Blocks.



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Piece the blocks together and finish the quilt:

1. Lay out Ogee Blocks in a 3 X 4 grid: stich into rows. then stitch rows together. (Diagram 5)



2. Layer, baste, and quilt as desired. Bind using your favorite method.

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Templates:

Note: double check the measurements on the templates when you print them to ensure they have printed at the correct size.
