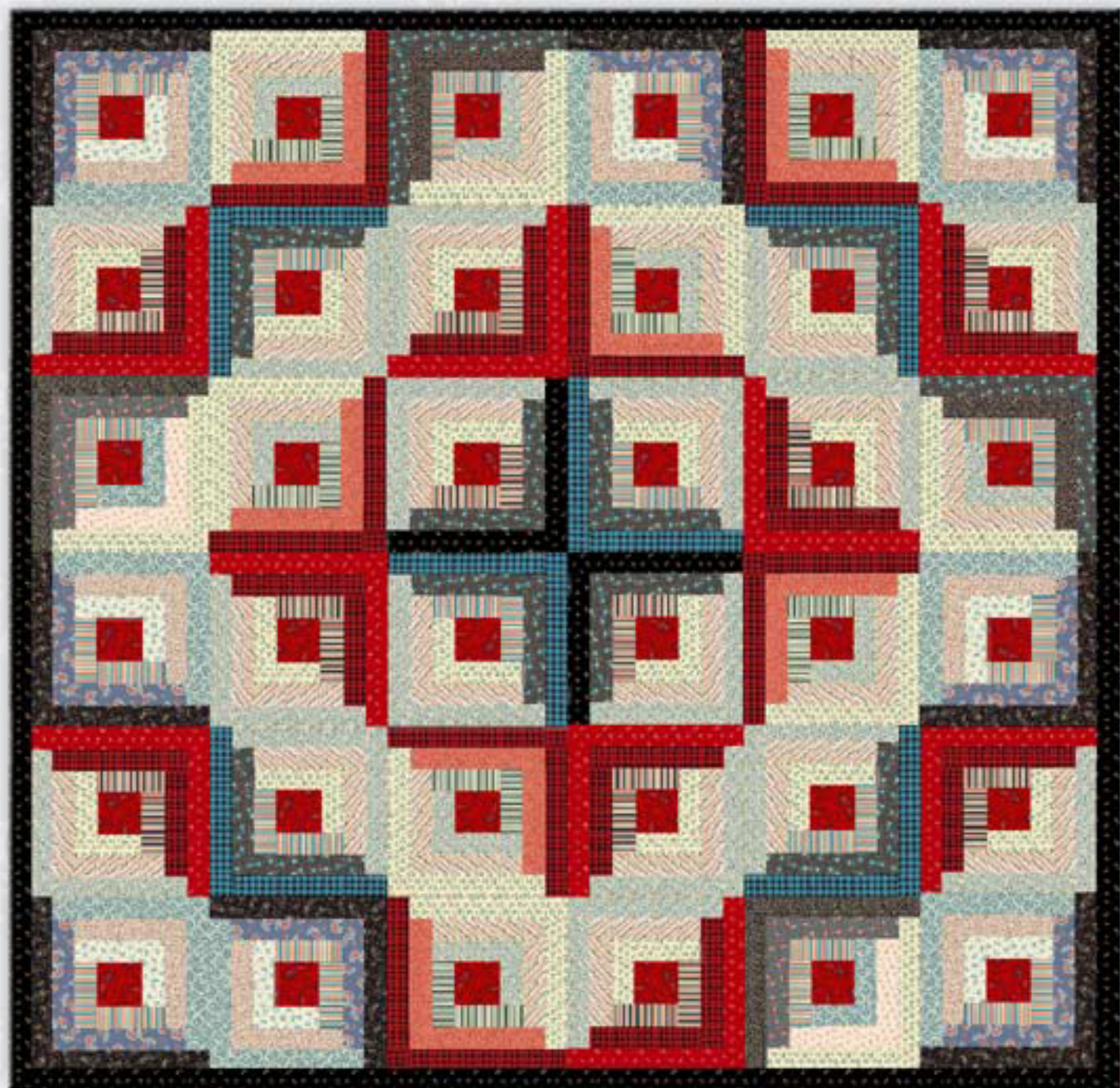

Yardage Required;

1/4 yard of each Farmhouse fabric

3/4 yard for binding,

3 1/4 yard for backing

Directions:

Cut 36 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"



The remaining fabrics are divided into light and darks. Those used as lights surround the top half of these directions. The darks surround the bottom half. This is a scrappy quilt with the fabrics arranged at random.

Cut: Pattern shape:

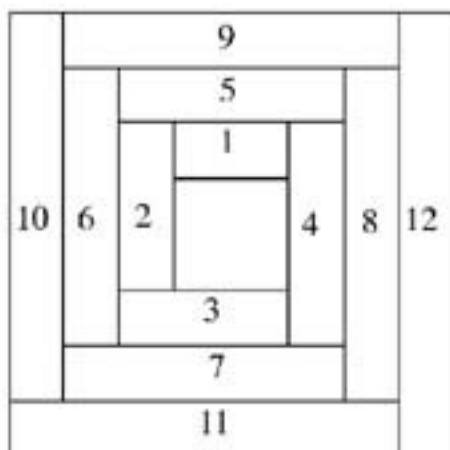
- #1 = Light fabric : 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" #2 = 1 1/2" x 3 1/2"
#5 = Light fabric : 1 1/2" x 4 1/2" #6 = 1 1/2" x 5 1/2"
#9 = Light fabric : 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" #10 = 1 1/2" x 7 1/2"

Cut: Pattern shape:

- #3 = Dark fabric : 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" #4 = 1 1/2" x 4 1/2"
#7 = Dark fabric : 1 1/2" x 5 1/2" #8 = 1 1/2" x 6 1/2"
#11 = Dark fabric : 1 1/2" x 7 1/2" #12 = 1 1/2" x 8 1/2"

Block Assembly:

Beginning with the center square, add the strips in a counter-clockwise manner according to the numerical sequence below, Make 36 blocks.
