

### Making the Quilt

Constructing the Foundation Pieced Block – To understand the process, make one complete block before chain piecing the other eight blocks.


 Print nine foundation patterns. These must measure 5 ½ inches unfinished. After printing nine foundation patterns trim each basket leaving the seam allowance. You can chain piece the remaining 8 blocks to make the process go faster.



 Put the first A1 fabric piece on the back of the foundation paper using a dab from glue stick. You can check your fabric positioning by holding your foundation paper pattern with the fabric up to light. Reposition as necessary.




Pin A2 on top of A1 with right sides together and stitch on the line on the front of the pattern. (No glue used beyond this point.)



4. Press away from seam line. Fold paper back on the sewing line (A3). Trim leaving a quarter of an inch seam allowance. This will assist in aligning the next piece.







Press Fold and trim

Align next piece



Sew fabric pieces A3, A5, and A7 using the same three 5. Pressing, folding and trimming, and aligning each piece.



6. Add the green background triangles A4 and A6.





7. Add the sand colored basket A8. Then add the two green bottom triangles A9 and A10.







8. Do not remove paper foundations until after adding sashing. Spraying paper lightly with water will make it easier to tear off paper.

#### Adding Sashing

9. Join three basket blocks with sashing strips, starting with a sashing strip at the beginning and at the end. Make three rows.





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10. Make four rows alternating the yellow cornerstone pieces with red sashing pieces ending with a cornerstone.




11. Now join the three rows of basket blocks with the sashing/cornerstone rows, as pictured.



#### **Adding Borders**

12. Sew the two side borders first. Then add the top and bottom borders. Press






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- 13. Add outer borders in the same way.
- 14. Make quilt sandwich. Quilt as desired. Trim and add binding.

Hints

- Sewing with smaller stitches and larger needle will make it easier to remove paper after joining the blocks.
- Remember tape can fix a torn paper foundation. (In case you have to un-sew.)

Make 9 copies of foundation pieced pattern. Finished Basket is five inches square. Add fabric pieces in numerical order.
