

Block Size: Finished 7" Quilt: 73 1/2 x 83 1/4"

Fabric Needed:

5/8 yard each of nine lights
Fat-Quarter each of 15 pinks
Fat-Eighth each of 29 brown and tans
5/8 yard - inner border
1 1/2 outer border
3/4 yard binding
5 1/4 yard backing

From the assorted lights, cut:

30 - 7 1/2" setting squares 6 - 11 1/4" squares, cutting each in half twice for a total of 24 setting triangles (2 extra) 2 - 8 1/2" squares, cut each in half once for a total of 4 corner triangles 1008 - 1 1/2" squares - flying geese 42 - 2 1/2" squares - block centers

From assorted pinks, cut:


42 - 5 5/8" squares, cutting each in half twice for a total of 168 - end triangles for flying geese units 252 - 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles for flying geese 42 - 2 3/4" squares, cutting each in half once for corner triangles on blocks

From assorted brown and tans, cut:

252 - 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles for flying geese 42 - 2 3/4" squares, cutting each in half once for corner triangles on blocks

Block Construction:

- 1. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each of the 1 1/2" light squares.
- 2. Align a marked square with one end of a 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangle. Stitch on the marked line. Trim away excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.
- 3. In the same manner, align the second 1 1/2" square with the opposite side of the rectangle. Stitch on the marked line and trim as before. Repeat for a total of 504 flying geese units.
- 4. Sew flying geese units together in groups of three.

- 5. Sew one large triangle to each side to two flying geese units.
- 6. Sew one flying geese unit to each side of one 2 1/2" square.





- 7. Sew these three units together and add one triangle to all four corners.
- 8. Repeat for a total of 504 blocks.



Quilt Assembly

- 1. Using picture as your guide lay out quilt. Sew together in diagonal rows.
- 2. Cut inner border fabric into seven strips 2 1/2" x width of fabric. Seam strips together.
- 3. Measure down center of quilt. Cut two borders to this length and add to each side of quilt. Measure across the center of your quilt. Cut two additional strips to this length and add to top and bottom of quilt.
- 4. Cut outer border fabric into 8 strips 5 1/2" x width of fabric. Seam strips together.
- 5. Measure and add outer border strips to quilt.

Quilt as desired. Bind with 2 1/2" wide strips.
