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Cutting your fabrics:

2 1/4 yards - From Main Pattern (33278-1 Cream):

Cut EIGHT 9 %" x 40/44" strips. Subcut each strip into FIVE 7 %" x 9 %" rectangles (Unit A). You will need a total of 40 Units A to make the sample quilt.

11/2 yards each - From various coordinating prints:

Cut FIFTEEN 3 %" strips. Subcut each strip into FIVE 7 %" x 3 %" rectangles (Unit B). You will need a total of 72 units B to make the sample quilt. Note: There are 10 prints but cut 5 selections of your choice to make the total of FIFTEEN strips

Note: the sample quilt uses the following prints for units B:



Backing: 4 yards


Binding: 2/3 yard 33280 - mix colors or one color - your choice

Constructing your quilt top:

To make the sample quilt, you will need to make a total of 32 whole blocks and 8 half blocks. Half blocks will be placed at either end of the alternate rows (rows 2, 4, 6, and 8).

To make the whole blocks:

Sew two units B to either side of a unit A. Press seams open.






Finished blocks should measure 7 %" x 15 %". Make a total of 32 whole blocks to make the sample quilt.

To make half blocks:


Sew one unit B to the side of a unit A. Press seam open.



Finished blocks should measure 7 %" x 12 %". Make a total of 8 half blocks to make the sample quilt.


When you have completed your 32 whole blocks and 8 half blocks, lay them out on a design wall or the floor in 9 rows alternating 4 and 5 blocks per row as shown in the quilt assembly diagram. Rows should be staggered, so that the seams from each block will not meet. Try to arrange your blocks so that the colors and textures of the units B are dispersed evenly throughout the quilt.

When you find an arrangement you like, sew the blocks together in rows, pressing seams open as you sew. Then sew rows to rows, pressing seams open. Don't worry about the end blocks in the alternate rows. When you complete the quilt top, you will square it up and trim them so they are even with the rest of the quilt.

Finishing your quilt

Don't forget about the finishing elements of your quilt! They are as important as the piecing. We quilted the Divine sample with an all-over stipple. The fabrics themselves are fairly busy, so we wanted to add texture without distracting from their beauty. We used a white cotton thread—again—to add texture and not be too distracting.

The sample quilt has a straight-grain binding. It is attached by machine and finished by hand.

Note: sample quilt uses a combination of prints # 33280-2 (green) and 33280-5 (red). Enjoy!
