



**Notes:** Be sure to read the entire pattern before you begin. This pattern uses paper piecing for the bottom of each beaker block (fabric pieces indicated with a PP). Cutting and yardage are for all (3) projects.

В	D A G	52039-2 White	1-1/8	(1) 9" x 40-1/2" strip for pillowcase. (5) 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew short ends together and subcut (2) 4-1/2" x 52-1/2" strips and (2) 4-1/2" x 50-1/2" strips.
С		52040-2 White	3/8	(1) 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut (11) 3-1/2" squares (1) 3-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut (4) 3-1/4" x 6" pieces (for PP2). (2) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut (7) 2-1/2" x 5" pieces (for PP2) and (11) 1-1/4" x 4-1/2" pieces.
D	**************************************	52041-1 Black	2-1/4	(1) 20-1/2" x 26-1/2" piece for pillowcase. (4) 3-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut (22) 3-3/4" x 6" pieces (for PP3 and PP4) (3) 2-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut (2) 2-3/4" x 12-1/2" and (2) 2-3/4" x 8" pieces for throw pillows and (22) 2-3/4" x 3-1/2" pieces. (8) 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew (3) strips short ends together and and cut (2) 2-1/2" x 50-1/2" strips. From remaining (5) strips, cut (2) 2-1/2" x 26-1/2" and (2) 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" strips for pillowcase and (2) 2-1/2" x 40-1/2" strips. (1) 2-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut (22) 2-1/4" x 1-1/4" pieces. (2) 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut (2) 1-1/2" x 40-1/2" strips. (1) 1-1/4" x WOF strip and (1) 1" x WOF strip. Subcut (4) 1" x 8" and (4) 1-1/4" x 8" pieces.



Additional Supplies: 16" square pillow form

\*If your panel size measures slightly smaller after trimming, cut E strips for first border 1/2" wider. After adding first border (step 7), measure and trim panel/first border unit to measure 40-1/2" wide  $\times$  29-1/2" high. This will ensure that the pieced beaker block borders fit exactly.

#### MAKING THE BEAKER BLOCKS

- **1.** Sew **D** 1-1/4" x 2-1/4" pieces to both short ends of (1) **C** 1-1/4" x 4-1/2" piece.
- **2.** Sew **D** 2-3/4" x 3-1/2" pieces to opposite sides of (1) **C** 3-1/2" square.
- 3. Sew the unit from step 1 to the unit from step 2 to make a beaker top unit. Make (11).











**4.** Using the Beaker Base paper piecing templates on pages 8 and 9 and your favorite paper piecing method, make a total of (5) **G** Beaker #1 base units, (2) **H** Beaker #1 base units, and (4) **F** Beaker #2 base units. Bases should measure  $8" \times 4-1/4"$ . Remove paper from beaker base units.



5. Sew (1) beaker top unit to each beaker base unit to make an 8" square block. Make (11).




**6.** Sew (2) **D** 1-1/4" x 8" pieces to opposite sides of (1) **H** beaker block. Sew (1) **F**, block, (1) **D** 1" x 8" piece and (1) **G** block on each side to make a block row. Make (2) block rows. Reserve remaining **G** beaker block for the throw pillow.



#### **ASSEMBLING THE QUILT**

- **7.** Sew **E** 3" x 25-1/2" strips to opposite sides of the **A** 35-1/2" x 25-1/2" panel. Sew **E** 2-1/2" x 40-1/2" strips to the top and bottom.
- **8.** Sew **D** 1-1/2" x 40-1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the panel section from step 6.
- **9.** Sew block rows to the top and bottom of the quilt center.
- **10.** Sew **D** 2-1/2" x 40-1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the quilt center.
- **11.** Sew **D** 2-1/2"  $\times$  50-1/2" strips to the left and right sides of the quilt center.
- **12.** Sew **B** 4-1/2"  $\times$  50-1/2" strips to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Sew **B** 4-1/2"  $\times$  52-1/2" strips to the top and bottom to complete the quilt top.

#### **FINISHING**


**13.** With the backing laying taut, place batting and then quilt top to form the quilt sandwich. Baste the sandwich and quilt as desired.



#### **MAKING THE THROW PILLOW**

**15.** Sew **D** 2-3/4"  $\times$  8" pieces to opposite sides of the remining **G** beaker block. Sew **D** 2-3/4"  $\times$  12-1/2" pieces to the top and bottom.

**16.** Sew **E** 2-1/2"  $\times$  12-1/2" pieces to opposite sides of the unit from step 15. Sew **E** 2-1/2"  $\times$  16-1/2" pieces to the top and bottom to complete the pillow front.



**17.** Layer the **E** 16-1/2" square right sides together on the pillow front. Stitch around all (4) sides using a 1/4" seam allowance and leaving an 8" opening along one edge for turning. Turn right side out, stuff with pillow form, and slip stitch the opening closed.



### MAKING THE PILLOWCASE


**18.** Sew **D** 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" pieces to opposite sides of the **A** 22-1/2" x 16-1/2" panel piece. Sew **D** 2-1/2" x 26-1/2" pieces to the top and bottom.

**19.** Sew the **D** 26-1/2" x 20-1/2" piece to the panel piece from step 18 to make the pieced pillowcase unit.



**20.** Fold the **E**  $2'' \times 40-1/2''$  strip in half lengthwise, wrong sides together, and press to make a flange.

- **21.** Lay the **B** 9" x 40-1/2" strip right side up. Layer the pieced pillowcase unit on top, right side up, matching raw edges. Lay the flange on top, matching raw edges. Pin raw edges to secure.
- **22.** Roll the pieced pillowcase unit up and fold the opposite long edge of the **B** strip around it, enclosing the rolled section inside. Align raw edges of the **B** strip and pin to secure. Stitch using a 1/4" seam allowance.






**23.** Pull the pillowcase unit out from inside the finished cuff and press flat. Fold the pillowcase in half, right sides together, and stitch along side and bottom raw edges, backstitching at the beginning and end. Zigzag stitch over seam allowances to prevent fraying. Turn pillowcase right side out and insert pillow.








Foundation pattern shown at 100%. Print 7 copies.
